Dear Citizens:

The Historic Rivers Chapter of the Virginia Master Naturalist Program is accepting applications for its Cohort X training class, which will begin Tuesday, September 1, 2015, and end March 9, 2016.

Most training classes will be selected Tuesday nights, 6-9 p.m. at the Human Services Building, 5249 Olde Towne Road in Williamsburg, and selected Saturdays for field trips. See the schedule on pages 3-4. Note: Dates are subject to change.

The Virginia Master Naturalist Program is a statewide corps of volunteers who provide education, outreach, and service dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within their communities. Interested Virginians become Master Naturalists through training and volunteer service.

People who are curious about nature, enjoy the outdoors, and want to be a part of natural resource management and conservation in Virginia are perfect candidates to become Virginia Master Naturalists.

The process for becoming a certified Virginia Master Naturalist typically takes 6 to 12 months. To become a member of the Historic Rivers Chapter, you must complete the basic training course. To become a Certified Virginia Master Naturalist, you must complete an additional 8 hours of Continuing Education plus 40 hours of Volunteer Service by December 2016.

Enrollment is limited to 25 applicants and will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. Tuition, which includes all materials and instruction, is \$150. The annual Chapter membership fee is currently \$25. The dues for 2016 can be paid between January 1 and March 9, 2016.

Here are the specific requirements of our Historic Rivers Chapter Basic Training:

- 1. We expect you to <u>attend</u> every class and field trip. Still, "life happens." You may miss two classes and one field trip and still graduate from Basic Training. See individual dates below; please keep in mind that dates may change.
- 2. <u>Attend</u> at least two hours on at least one bird walk or bird club field trip, with either the Williamsburg Bird Club or the Hampton Roads Bird Club. You will receive information about these opportunities early in the program.
- 3. Attend at least two hours on at least one native plant walk with a chapter of the Virginia Native Plant Society. The local John Clayton Chapter leads 1 2 walks per month in the fall (sometimes more). You will receive information about these opportunities early in the program.
- 4. <u>Attend</u> at least one program, **in person**, in the series "VIMS After Hours" presented the last Thursday of most months at VIMS in Gloucester Point, VA. You will receive information about these opportunities early in the program.
- 5. <u>Attend</u> at least one meeting of the Historic Rivers Chapter Board, which meets the first Wednesday of each month.
- 6. <u>Develop/Write and present</u> as a group, a biography of a noted naturalist/scientist. You will receive information about this requirement early in the program.
- 7. A short open book/notes quiz, distributed by email, may follow each class session (to be announced). You must <u>complete and return</u> the quizzes by the due date. These quizzes are reviewed but are not graded.
- 8. An open book/notes final exam will be distributed by email, during the last several weeks of the program. You <u>must achieve 70%</u> on the final exam in order to graduate from the program.

Most training classes will be held on Tuesday nights at the Human Services Building, 5249 Olde Towne Road in Williamsburg.

Unless otherwise noted, evening classes begin promptly at 6:00 p.m. and end before 9:00 p.m. The 2015-2016 specific training dates are below. Dates are subject to change. Note: September 2015 and February 2016 will include Saturday classes (different from field trips).

Basic Training Classes (dates are subject to change):

September 2015: Tuesday, September 1; Tuesday, September 15; Saturday, September 26; Tuesday, September 29 (plus one field trip)

October 2015: Tuesday, October 13, Tuesday, October 27 (plus one field trip)

November 2015: Tuesday, November 10 and Tuesday, November 17 (plus one field trip)

December 2015: Tuesday, December 1(plus one field trip)

January 2016: Tuesday, January 5 (plus two field trips)

February 2016: Tuesday, February 2, Saturday, February 6, Tuesday, February 16, and Saturday, February 20

March 2016: Wednesday, March 9, 2016– Graduation from Basic Training

Basic Training Field Trips:

Six Saturday (Sunday as needed) field trips will be scheduled over the period September to February. <u>Dates are "to be determined"</u> and will be finalized prior to Basic Training.

- 4. You will be expected to do work and research outside of class
- 5. You will be expected to do research on the Internet
